

Answers

'Best Sniffer-Outer of Food' Survivor award winner: Rose (as her 'Smell' rating is the highest).

'Strongest Claws' award winner: Worzel (as his 'Claw Strength' rating is highest).

'Most Attractive Male' award winner: Wolfie (as his 'Attractiveness' rating is the highest of the male meerkats).

'Best at Spotting Predators' award winner: Springy (as his 'Sight' rating is the highest).

Which of the nominees is <u>least likely</u> to win 'Fastest Escape from a Hungry Bird of Prey': Sandy (as her 'Speed' rating is the lowest).

'Fastest Escape from a Hungry Bird of Prey' award winner: Rose (as her 'Speed' rating is the highest).

'Ultimate Survivor' award winner: Rose (as she has won two awards). This makes her the best competitor and the most likely to survive.

Which group will re-dig their burrow more quickly?

The stripy mob will re-dig their burrow more quickly. Their total 'Claw Strength' rating is 24 (2 + 5 + 7 + 10 = 24) compared to the spotty mob, whose total 'Claw Strength' rating is only 21 (6 + 3 + 4 + 8 = 21).

Can you think of any other resources that might be scarce in their desert habitat?

There are many possible answers to this. The key resource is likely to be water, which is rare in deserts. Water is one of the most important resources an animal needs, so competition for access to water will be very strong.

Penguins are thinking of starting their own 'Survivors' awards. Do you think they would have the same awards? Why? What other awards might they have? What other resources might they compete for in their polar habitat?

Some of the awards and categories would be the same, such as 'Best at Spotting Predators' and 'Speed'. This is because, like meerkats and other animals, penguins need to keep an eye out for and escape from predators (like leopard seals) and compete for food. They also have surprisingly good senses of smell, which they use to find food. Males and females will compete with other males and females for the best mates, so attractiveness would remain a category on their profiles and 'Most Attractive Male/Female' would remain good Survivor awards. Penguins do not have claws for digging, so 'Claw Strength' would not be a useful category. Perhaps 'Agility' would replace it, with a 'Most Agile' award, as they would need to be good at twisting and turning in the water to catch fish. 'Holding their Breath' would also be a good replacement, with a 'Longest Dive' award, as penguins need to hold their breath whilst swimming. Those who can hold their breath for longest would be able to better compete for food. Instead of competing for shelter, penguins huddle together for warmth on open ice sheets and rotate who gets to be in the middle of the huddle. However, they would compete for the best nest sites, for example.

Do you agree with Luke that Springy should have won the 'Ultimate Survivor' award?

There is no right answer here. Luke has a point though: is it better to be very good at one thing, or be fairly good all round? It depends! Springy might be really good at spotting predators and avoid being eaten, but that will be no use if he starves or can't find water or shelter. On balance, it might be better to have a range of skills, although that still does not guarantee survival. This is why competition is such an important part of an animal's life, it's not enough just to find resources, you've got to find them before anyone else, if you want to survive!
